

CAR CARE CORNER

Hi all members, friends & fellow car enthusiasts!
Gorgeous weather in Melbourne for many weeks now, yet our beautiful Classics are being abused just by not using them for months/years on end! This makes no sense! USE IT OR LOOSE IT!

A truer word was never spoken! I cannot believe how sad my Cobra felt after a long period off the road waiting for a Genuine Long Range Fuel Tank, since the original tank could no longer stand the missing Lead in ULP that offered rust protection in the old "Super" of the 70's! Even after I changed ALL FLUIDS inc Brake Fluid being the most important safety wise, she still needed "running-in"! even at 45 years old! She settled in after a while with TLC, and is back to her status quo!

Now those of you contemplating your own water pump replacement, don't be put off. All, except those with Timing Belts, are easy to replace. TAKE plenty of PHOTOS at each stage to remind you order of operations. Always compare all measurements between the old pump and the new one BEFORE you try to install. If engine & pump are able to be run before renewal and you see rust in the water, flush with approved chemicals till clean. (Thermostat must be removed and it's housing temporarily replaced) Drain system completely if possible. (via Engine Block Cock or Screw-Plug)

Take Radiator to Specialist for complete clean-out if you even have a 1% doubt to its condition. With radiator and its hoses out, the pump removal is a piece of cake. If your pump has any Switches or fittings that need to be transferred to new pump, remove them before you remove the pump. Don't force anything. Use soaking products/Releasing Agents, and be patient, even if soaking takes overnight. Place ALL parts in a box for safekeeping. CLEAN thoroughly the surface where pump goes.


A common blade often makes gasket removal easy. A dedicated scraper can be made from any old flat file if you have a bench grinder. If not, an old bull-nose table knife can help a lot. Apply sealer cement to both surfaces. If difficult, then coat both sides of new gasket. Never use old gasket. Ensure ALL holes and bolts/nuts are clean. If any bolt holes penetrate the water jacket, ensure sealant goes on those bolts. (important) Get 2 bolts in half way, as you install new pump, then install the others also half way. Turn pump now and then as you tighten all bolts back "home"(important). Stop if you cannot turn pump and explore causes. If you're not using a Tension Wrench as you should, do not tighten any pump bolts/nuts with any more force than you would with a house tap. Check again new pump turns freely. Replace all bits you have any doubts about as you refit everything.

Ask the Rad Specialist to test your CAP too. Fill system with clean water while engine is running until you feel heat as thermostat opens, assuming you tested it when it was out. System CANNOT be cleaned with Thermostat installed. Hint: drill a 1/2 to 1 mm hole on Flange of Thermostat between outer edge and Valve to assist air bleeding. If it has a jiggle pin in hole, cut it off leaving just a hole. Double check tightness of all hoses and switches and fittings. Use Sealant where required. After engine has warmed up and you're sure Radiator is full, go for a 2-3 km roadtest with a container of spare water. Constantly watch Temp Gauge and stop car and engine if it gets too hot. Lift bonnet and look for leaks. If no leaks u may have an air lock which usually clears itself as engine cools down. When cool after 20 mins, very carefully remove Cap with a towel on CAP. Top up with spare water till full and REPLACE CAP. After temperature behaves normally and all looks well, repeat above operations by draining entire cooling system, and refill with 50% water and 100% Concentrated Coolant. Start with adding 1 litre of 100% Concentrated Coolant and then 1 lite of Clean Water with engine off. Keep adding 50/50 till you have 4-6 litres in and start engine at idle. Keep adding at 50/50 as you did with straight water as above.
