

### **OUTBACK ADVENTURES**

Annette and I have tried three times to do the Anne Beadell Highway, a back track of 1350km from Coober Pedy, South Australia to Laverton, Western Australia. Each time there has been a different reason for not being able to do it; the first time I got sick, the second time it rained when we were under way and the track was closed, the third time it had rained earlier in the year but we thought it would be okay however, when we got there it was still closed. So, this year it was a change of plans.

We headed to Uluru then down The Great Central Road to Laverton to meet up with our travelling mates. On the way we stopped for fuel and spotted a group of Citroen 2CV's. There must have been about 20 cars and their owners camped in the camping area. They were on what they called "the 2CV Raid run". A bit further on we passed a Goggomobil group, also on a run.

It seemed we picked spots to stop that had some mechanical displays. Our stop at Gwala, an old historic township which also has a mine and mining museum, we spotted more machinery.

Kalgoorlie was impressive with the giant mining vehicles. I am six-foot plus tall and I didn't even come up to the top of the rim of the wheel of the dump truck. There were about 20 steps to get to the cabin. The face bucket holds around 70tonnes of ore, and it takes 4 loads to fill the tray of a haul truck.

We passed through a little place called Lake King which has the Bush Engineers Tractor Museum. These tractors were modified by local farmers to suit their farm and its conditions. They wanted more horse power but the tractors weren't around in the 1970's that would do the job, so they took bits from different machines to make what they needed. For example, Big Bertha was made from:

- Chassis RHS steel
- Engine, gearbox, diffs Leyland 600 Hippo truck ~1960
- Transfer case Mack truck
- Fuel tank Volvo truck
- Cab Toyota Ute

We visited a tourist homestead, "Koomabla", that was no longer lived in. In the past any vehicle that broke down and was unable to be repaired, was left there. There were Holdens, Fords, Minis, and many more.

On the way home, we visited the Birdwood Motor Museum in Birdwood South Australia. This museum is well worth a visit if you get a chance. From a full-size Camry made from Lego to motorbikes, racing cars to vintage and veteran and classic cars. There were some very rare cars and bikes. Interestingly, there was a 1920 T model Ford that was badged in Australia as a Palm. The racing car driven by Jack Myers was on display. This Cooper Bristol was fitted with a Holden engine with a Waggott double overhead cam alloy head. From 1956 Jack was very successful driver in the WM Holden until in 1960 when he crashed it at Bathurst. The Lightburn Zeta was displayed. There was also a Zeta sports, utility runabout. These Australian made micro cars were powered by a Villiers twin cylinder motor with a capacity of 324cc and 16 hp, it weighed 508kg. Only 363 Zetas were sold from 1963 to 1965.

We made it home safely after what was a fantastic trip to Western Australia and back!

# A REMINDER OF CLUB PERMIT RULES FROM VICROADS

If you don't follow club permit rules, you may be fined.

To keep your club permit, you must:

- be a member of an approved club or association. If you switch clubs, you can't have a gap longer than 14 days between your memberships.
- keep a log book of your trips
- make sure anyone driving the vehicle follows their licence conditions
- tell VicRoads if: your vehicle's details change (for example, vehicle colour, or garage address)
- your personal details change (address, name)
- you join a new club

Using a log book - follow these rules to use your log book correctly.

- Attach a club permit to the club log book.
- Complete a log book entry every time you drive the vehicle If you drive a vehicle multiple times in a day, only record the first use by the first driver.
- If your trip spans before and after midnight, put an entry in your log book for each day.
- Don't write log book entries for future journeys.
- Only use as many entries as your permit allows. Once you use the entries up, you can't drive more than 100 metres from its garage address until you get another permit. For example, a 45-day club permit can only use the first 45 entries. You can get a second 45-day club permit and attach it to the log book.


## **RED ROBIN CATCH-UPS**

# Golden Oldies Tour 25/8/2024 - 1/9/2024

Simoen, Dot the Silky, Lily the Dachshund and I took part in the Golden Oldie Tour in August with our 1925 15/30 Crossley Tourer. This was our fourth Golden Oldies Tour that we have done.

In 2006 and 2008, on both times, we didn't finish. We had Magneto and Big End Failure. In 2015 we completed the tour, even with my right hand in plaster. 2024 how will we go?

The start of the tour was from the Marong Federation Picnic. With other tour entrants we were parked to one side as a group. At 1.30pm after the raffles were completed, we were flagged of as a group.

On Sunday afternoon, heading from Marong, we went through back roads to Dunolly, with many stopping at the local museum. Afterwards, our two-night stopover was in Maryborough. Between Dunolly and Maryborough, we hit a heavy downpour with water spraying into the car and heaps of water flowing across the road. I was asked by someone if the car is waterproof. Most vintage owners with tourers, will answer "that the car keeps the rain out but it's not waterproof". Dinner that night was at the Maryborough Highland Club.

On the Monday morning, the day started at Victoria Park Football Ground Maryborough. From here we ventured off to Clunes, visiting the Bottle Museum (well worth a visit). As we left Clunes we went past the local Primary School with students and teachers lining the school fence enjoying the vintage cars driving past. From Clunes via Newstead, we went to Castlemaine via back roads, having lunch in a public hall. After lunch we visited the Harley Shop where the owner had a great range of vintage and classic motorcycles.

We left the motorcycles and headed to Maldon stopping at the local museum. This is also well worth a visit, then making our way back to our accommodation with dinner at the Maryborough Racecourse.

Tuesday, we were going to meet the convoys of cars from where we were staying but I noticed that I had a flat tyre, instead, I took my wheel and spare tube (I always carry a spare tube) to be repaired with intentions of meeting the group later. On my way back to Newstead I stopped for one of the vintage cars that was parked on the side of the road with its bonnet up. We ended up taking Peter and Linda to Bendigo so they could get their modern car and trailer. Dinner that night was at the Bowls Club, Daylesford.

On Wednesday, we met at the Lake in Daylesford, heading towards Ballarat, visiting a Garden Art centre for morning tea and a look at their sculptures and steel art. Heading from here, we went to Jill and Graeme's place for lunch and a look at their shed. This was not just an ordinary shed, the set up with cars, trucks, and FJ camper trailer plus along the walls are shop fronts with period sign-writing. From here we went closer to Ballarat and visited a few more private collections. From steam engines, wedding dresses to a garage set up with displays. (At this stage, the tour group was spilt into two groups). We went back to our van and had a casual evening meal.

Thursday, it was pack up time; we packed up the van, hooked up the Ranger (Simoen towing), we went from Daylesford, via Trentham for morning tea/lunch and a walk around the town. Friday morning, we took off to Bungaree, visiting the Trigg's Collection and morning tea. This was a great collection and we enjoyed homemade slices. Gordon was the next stop for lunch, visiting two shops, a hat shop and an interesting hat/clothing and other items store. Husband and wife own both. From here we split into two groups visiting a collection of motorcycles and then a shed set up with different car, tractors, mowers and more. Both were great collections.

Saturday turned out to be an easy day, meeting as a group and heading to the Ballarat Tram Museum. A good collection of trams and the group boarded three trams for a ride along the Lake. This is also well worth a visit. Free time afterwards with a farewell dinner at the Golf Club that night. This included some speeches, live music good food and company with an auction, selling off road placards used for the tour and spare number plates. Approx \$1600 was raised for charity. A great night was had by all.



## A RARE FIND - Shane Perrott

I own a 1935 Crossley Regis, fully restored which I purchased in January, 2021 from Peter in Hawks Nest NSW.

For the last 30 years, it was the only one that Peter knew off in Australia and one of thirty-seven left worldwide.

In April this year a chap was selling a Wilson ENV 75 Pre select gearbox that fits the Regis on Ebay. These gearboxes only suit a few other cars. While I was interested in the gearbox, I was away and had other things on the go. I contacted the seller and wondered if he could ask the buyer if they had a Crossley.

To my surprise, he came back to me and said that he has got a Regis. After some communication between him and myself, we organised to have a look at it in May. We ended up buying it and picked it up in August.


It had been sitting in a garage in Ballarat for over 40 years and the family were cleaning up the shed as wife is still alive but her husband had passed on a few years ago.

From the body numbers, we believe that it is a 1936 model. It has an Australian body which is most likely from the Ruskin Body works. My 1935 Regis is also a Ruskin Body. They have a 10hp Coventry Climax engine (made under license by Crossley) with overhead inlet valves and side valve exhaust.

The body is extremely rust free with all parts of the car, maybe this could possibly be my retirement project in 5 years' time!!



The Florence Thomson Tour for female drivers in classic cars is happening again.


In 2025 the tour is based in the midst of Victoria's fabulous Gold Fields, just 115 kms from Melbourne.


The tour's aim is to show a diverse range of vehicles and hence places are limited.
