Brief History of the Z3

The first BMW Z3 was launched into the US market in 1996 with a pre-production preview in the James Bond movie *Golden Eye* in 1995. The Z3 was BMW's answer to the Mazda MX5 (known as the *Miata*i in the US.)

In 1995 a new factory was established in Spartanburg South Carolina to exclusively build the Z3. These cars were never produced in Germany. This Spartanburg plant today produces BMW X5 and X3 SUVs. All Z cars are now made in Germany as is the small X1 SUV.

About 300,000 Z3 cars were sold over the lifetime of the model until 2002 when the Z4 was introduced as the replacement.

At launch, many automotive writers liked the optional 2.8L 6 but bagged the 4 pot Z3 as being underpowered. But over time this little Bimmer has been described as a very livable fun car that is an absolute delight to drive on twisty country roads, especially with the top down. The Z3 is very popular in both Europe and the States with plenty of spares, knowledge and mechanics to keep them on the road and track.

In 1997 the first Z3 roadsters were sold in Australia.

The History of our Z3

Our Z3 was built in November 1999 and is a 2000 Model Year update at which time BMW discontinued the 4 cyl. engine and concentrated on a 2.0L and 3.0L line 6. The Z 3 M series used a different power plant and other "go faster" tricks.

Our car is a 2.0 L with BMW's "Varnos" variable valve timing system used in all 6 cyl. cars from 1998. From about 2011 a new range of turbo 4 Cyl engines has been offered to most BMW products. An upgraded turbo in line 6 is available for their higher performance models. Smaller 3 Cyl. engines are also available on some cars. Diesels are on offer in the X5 and X3 variants.

Our car was first registered in Adelaide in 2000 and finally made its way to Victoria with its second owner in July 2011. We purchased the car in October 2019.

Bill gave out the run sheets and we headed off through Windermere, Weatherboard and Burrumbeet along Remembrance Drive to Learmonth and finally to the Mount Mitchell Estate, some 8kms beyond Waubra on the Sunraysia Highway. Following the recent rain, the countryside is green again and the autumn colours are on display, so with the added bonus of the sunshine it was a lovely drive and well planned.

On our arrival at Mount Mitchell Homestead we were warmly welcomed by Kate Tol who, with her husband Simon, have owned this historic property for the last nine years and have carried out extensive renovations. Our visit began in the heritage listed stables where Kate had prepared her, still warm, home baked scones and jam and cream, along with tea and coffee. A great way to start the visit with a morning tea, during which Kate traced the history of the estate which was settled in 1838 with ninety six thousand acres and the boundaries ran from the present property to Buninyong – some fifty miles! The beautiful bluestone homestead was built in 1860 by the Robertson family who owned the property until 1926, and the noted architect, Charles Webb, also designed the Windsor Hotel, the Royal Arcade in Melbourne and Melbourne Grammar School.

Then it was time for a tour of the grounds of the property along with Kate and her three energetic Border Collie sheep dogs. Mount Mitchell homestead has ten acres of manicured gardens including roses, a kitchen garden, cypress and hawthorn hedges and an extensive lake as the perfect backdrop. It was a delight to visit this property and its buildings and grounds!

Having farewelled Kate at Mount Mitchell we travelled back to Learmonth where Judy and Bill had selected a sunny spot in the park beside Lake Learmonth for our picnic lunch and a chat. As usual there was plenty of humour and stories which kept us entertained for an hour or so and it was a very relaxing way to finish the day. The most important topics covered during lunch were the variety and effectiveness of hearing aids, knee replacements and the treatment of heart conditions! Classic cars did not get a look-in! Maybe we are getting older!

Oh, and if anyone finds a petrol cap for a Jaguar XJ6, please return it to Lyle.
