
We then went back to Murrabit to Jack Dyer's place where they had a good fire going although the weather was quite warm and was nice all day.

SHVCVC Weekend Away - Deniliquin - 17th to 19th May 2024

Friday at 8:30am we left the Railway Car Park and headed off for a weekend of exploring. Our first stop was at Barham for morning tea and opportunity to thaw out in the sun.

Following the Back Roads Trail, we stuck to the bitumen and found The Old School Winery and Meadery at Womboota. This is a friendly small-scale winery operation with four varieties of Mead (mulled honey wine) to taste and buy. Attached is also a Pottery Studio, where we could view the resident potter making things on the wheel and learn about the different types of clay and processes and buy the wares on offer.

After a picnic lunch by their welcoming outdoor fire we headed to Mathoura to look for water birds at the Reed Beds Bird Hide and Boardwalk. Strolling along the path we discovered that there was no water or water birds, but plenty of others in the trees, so a pleasant walk in nature just the same.

Once in Deni we had time to settle in and rest before joining the members of Deniliquin District Veteran and Vintage Car Club for a BBQ Dinner. The members were warm and welcoming and we even took out first and third prizes in the raffle.

Saturday was a later start, for a visit to The Depot, to see cars, bikes, buses, motoring and household memorabilia. It was an immaculately presented display in what was the Purtill's Bus Depot. Heading out of town toward Finley we travelled to The Long Table Café, in Warragoon.

We were given a tour of this mixed hobby farm property, and then sampled the farm grown produce in a tasty lamb casserole, and lemon tart and apple crumble.

A visit to the Deni Ute Muster Museum filled in the afternoon, with a few displays, gift shop and interesting conversation with the staff.

It was too cold to gather in the Camp Kitchen for dinner, so the venue moved to Daly's Cabin for a three course dinner for 24 people. I'm not sure if Lunch was too filling or we over catered but there was more than enough food to go round. Many thanks to our Chefs David, Carol & Kevin.

A Quiz was held to test our knowledge on Australia, and it proves we need to study harder.

Sunday morning saw us at the Peppin Heritage Centre located in the Deni Information Complex, to view the history of the Air Force Flying School set up to train pilots during WW2. Along with the facts and figures were personal stories, and service summaries of the men and women involved in setting up and running the School. Much of the origin was based on local farmers ingenuity and commitment to the cause, and some larrikin competitions between the military personnel.

Well worth a visit. Our next stop was at The Deni & District Historical Society which was located in the 1880s Police Inspector's Residence. The volunteers there have done a good job with the selection of local artifacts and displaying them in themed rooms, according to subject matter.

After a cuppa and chat with staff and author of local history book, we moved on.

Our club members were invited by Edward River Motoring Enthusiasts Group to display our cars . along with theirs in the middle of town to recognise

New South Wales Motor Heritage Day. Many of our group chose to do this and meet a few more likeminded people.

We headed home to Swan Hill in the afternoon, having discovered there's more to Deni than you might think at first glance. All in all it was a good weekend with great weather and company. Put your name down now for the next trip away to make sure you don't miss out on the fun.







PERMIT RENEWALS

There are only two ways to have your Club Permits renewed.

Bring your Club Permit renewal and your completed safety check sheet to the monthly meeting. Hand it into the permit officer who will sign and stamp it to have ready to collect at the end of the meeting. Mail your Club Permit renewal along with your signed and completed safety check sheet. Please ensure that you include a stamped self-addressed envelope so that the renewal an be returned to you straight away. **DO NOT SEND** your Club Permit book or money. Payments are to be made by the owner at Vic Roads

Always ensure that there is a completed safety check form for each renewal. These forms are available on our website under members section, www.shvcvc.com.au or in our Manifold. The club's Post Office box is cleared every day, and the renewals are returned in the post the next day.

Remember that if your renewal is overdue Vic Roads will not re-register your vehicle and you will have to complete a roadworthy to re-register your vehicle. So when you get your renewal get it proceeded straight away and then you have it ready to pay the renewal when its due.
