Old Vehicle Modernisation.

Users of older vehicles have a few problems travelling with modern traffic. Most have no trouble keeping up, but stopping can sometimes be difficult. Disc brakes & ABS have been around for many years, but you'd be hard pressed to find these on many of our fleet. I was recently asked about brake lining material, as Asbestos is no longer in fashion and many old vehicles don't react well to modern linings. The answer is to talk to an "old bloke in the trade", meaning find out a good clutch & brake specialist with a staff member who has been there for many years. I went through this process 20 years ago, and luckily a friend of a friend put me on to Derry at B.T.G Brake & Clutch in Melbourne. He knew exactly my situation and the vehicle I was working on. He recommended a lining material that was used on mechanical machinery, like cranes, excavators and automotive drum brakes. These people were able to bond the material-Ferodo 3923-to my shoes and after turning them to fit the drums, job complete. Closer to home, there are some good people at Power Brakes, Gillies Plains in Adelaide. Sadly, we don't seem to have these people locally anymore.

Another important upgrade is your head lights. When driving around at night, many cars have amber lights, caused by the old globes deteriorating over time. Even replacing with new incandescent globes gives an improvement, but the ultimate fix is Quartz Halogen, or in a few cases LED. "I've got 6 volts" you say. No problem, talk to the friendly people at Classic & Vintage Bulbs in Adelaide. They can supply all the above upgrade globes and carry a large range of Lucas parts for the English vehicle owner. Now you have no reason for not seeing at night or being able to stop effectively. Rig



All vehicles must have a certificate of roadworthiness plus photos for club records as Vicroads may request to see them.

Hard copy photos required of your car:

Front view

Flags Small

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side

Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.
