Eyes On The Road

We are constantly being reminded of the "Towards Zero" the campaign by our various road authorities, who are the same people who allow numerous signs to be erected along the roadsides. One of the greatest contributors to accidents is in-attention & not looking ahead. Speed Limit signs are one of the big offenders in this area, as we are constantly looking at our speedo & scanning the road for a sign indicating the limit at that point. In the Mildura area alone we have 20, 30, 40, 50, 60, 70 & 80 areas. Along with many vehicles having certain controls on a screen and the many advertising billboards, it's no wonder there are so many minor accidents. In Queensland, there are a new series of distracting signs such as "Crests Can Limit Visibility", "Opening Your Eyes Helps Avoid Accidents" and others with stupid messages. It makes you wonder about the decision makers!

How Many Makers Is Too Many?

A few years ago, there weren't a large number of makes to choose from in Australia, but I read recently that there are now sixty-five brands on the market down under, with several more Chinese brands about to be launched. (There are 200 EV manufacturers in China now.) Australia is a choice market for China, as there is no import duty on their vehicles, whereas the US has imposed a 100% tax, the EU has varying amounts around the 30% mark. Why hasn't Australia got one, but we still have a luxury car tax which was supposed to help our vehicle industry.

How Much Power Is Too Much?

GM has recently released the latest Chev Corvette, with what they claim as the most powerful engine ever used in a car. 1,064 HP, top speed about 350 km/h. Just the thing for a trip to Broken Hill, as the 'roos wouldn't have time to jump in front of you!

How Reliable Is Your Car?

A 15-year study in the US has determined that the Lexus brand is the most reliable, with Alfa, Land Rover, Audi & BMW at the other end of the list. They also determined that EV's are less reliable than real cars!

The Right Noise.

As there have been complaints from certain quarters re the lack of noise from an EV, some manufacturers are now building in sound emitters in their vehicles. One would assume that this wouldn't cost the maker much, unlike some instances in the past.

In 1969, Plymouth released their famous Road Runner, complete with a horn that emitted a "meep meep" sound. This exercise cost the company \$50,000 for the rights to use the bird logo, and another \$10,000 to develop the horn, which is a valuable & prized possession these days. The cars themselves also command huge dollars at auction.

The sound of the indicators in the new Rolls Royce EV mimics the clinking whisky glasses! Certainly better than the sounds of some vehicles these days.

New Vehicles for VIC club permit scheme.

All vehicles must have a certificate of roadworthiness plus photos for club records as Vicroads may request to see them.

Hard copy photos required of your car:

Front view

Rear view

Drivers position (Side on view with door open)

Passenger side

Drivers side

Body and Engine numbers, stampings and plates or VIN number

Present this information to the permit scheme officers, they will do the appropriate paperwork for Vicroads.

Also remember to keep your old logbooks for 12 months.
