My chummy has had an ulster ratios 3 speed gearbox for the last 30 years.

Wonderful when car is driver only. But, when going on trips, with a full holiday load on board, it has frequently been an embarrassment, when requiring a start on an steep uphill eg trying to get out of Eskine Falls Rd Lorne - I needed to back up road. Second and third are like Ruby 3 & 4—perfect at touring speeds—no more screaming in second.

But that high first gear is also hard on the clutch, which eventually disintegrated—so it now has new bonded linings.

The replacement box, built be Brian Gibbons, has the Ulster second gear ratio, but first gear remains original standard gearbox first.

Hope this will prove perfect for touring.

#### **VALE Gordon Dobie**

#### **EDITOR's Note**

It is only a few months ago that Russell, in his Membership Report, said: "Gordon Dobie of Moorabbin is renewing some old acquaintances, having previously been a member in 1959 and the early '60s when he was involved with the racing fraternity. It was nice to meet Gordon at the Plum Pudding Night.", and I added, "...Gordon joined the Club in 1962, as member No 834 ....", but, to do justice to his memory, Tony Johns provided the following.

\*\*\*\*\*\*\*

Gordon Dobie and his friend John Robertson joined the club in 1959 with the intention of building an Austin 7 to compete in Hillclimbs and Race meetings in the Austin 7 Formula class.

The Austin was entered under John's name as the owner; Gordon was the constructor and they both shared the driving.


At Rob Roy, 20 August 1961, John drove the Austin, Gordon also competed that day, driving one of the two Austins entered by Ian Wells under his Willsmere Service Station banner.


A month later, this time at Templestowe, it was Gordons turn to drive. Nigel Tait was having one of his first outings at the same meeting.


I first met Gordon in the pits at the Templestowe Hillclimb when I took this photo of their Austin showing the Ruby chassis and the 3 bearing motor as well as the John Fleming, alloy wheels and hydraulic brake backing plates.

Gordon went on to lower the class record at Templestowe in October 1962, previously held by Jacques Sapir with a new time of 62.21 seconds. John Whitehouse was the first to break the 60 second barrier recording 59.92 seconds.

John Whitehouse later lowered his time to 56.1 seconds, which was still the class record when the hill was closed.

If you compare the two photos you will see Gordon has shortened the two exhausts pipes. Recently when I asked about this his reply was, the extra length did not add any more power so I saved weight by cutting them off.

Gordon and John also competed at the Hepburn Springs Hillclimb and from memory Gordon still holds the Austin 7 record there.

Possibly Gordon's last drive of the Austin was at the Geelong Speed Trials in 1964, where again he lowered the class record to 17.92 seconds.

Working for John Roxburgh, Gordon was responsible for the preparation of the Datsun Racing Team cars, first the sports cars and later the saloon cars that raced at Sandown and Bathurst. During this period he established a

close friendship with Doug Whiteford, former triple Australian Grand Prix winner and Datsun Team driver.

Gordon acquired a workshop in Beach Road Hampton to prepare both his Datsun competition cars as well as those for his clients. After retiring from racing in 2017 he authored the book 'Racing For Fun' that tells the story of his involvement in Australian motor sport.

One story Gordon related about Doug Whiteford, was a 1960s Sandown Park meeting where Gordon was preparing the Datsun 2000 sports car when Doug saw his old Lago Talbot being towed around the pits, coughing and banging but refusing to start, when Doug said to me "I think I know what's wrong, to set up the timing the magneto should be turned anticlockwise to the stop then turned 15/16th of an inch clockwise".

Doug's offer of help was gratefully accepted and the current owner, Graham Thompson was so pleased he offered Doug a drive. Gordon then stated "that was one of the highlights of my time with Doug seeing him back in the Lago's seat after more than ten years." He didn't hang about, blasting off the line and around the first corner with the tail hanging out demonstrating the skill that made him the first man to win three Australian Grand Prix.

Our thoughts go out to his wife Judy.

A recent article from RACV, is well worth reading in full, it appeared in mid-July, posted by Nicola Dowse

"Most people aren't aware of their bad habits and need an expert to point them out. These are the most common bad driving habits witnessed by RACV Drive School instructors."

- ⇒ Not signalling at roundabouts
- ⇒ Incorrect vehicle shutdown technique
- ⇒ Not indicating when changing lanes
- $\Rightarrow$  Hands at 10 and 2, not 9 and 3
- ⇒ Being inflexible with driving route
- ⇒ Driving on painted islands
- ⇒ Using bicycle and bus lanes incorrectly
- ⇒ Only using headlights at night
- ⇒ Illegally parking near continuous lines
- $\Rightarrow$  Low level speeding

Many of these need a read of the article to fully understand.

I must admit that I have a few favourite bad habits - not mine.

- Performing U-turns across continuous lines (common in shopping centres and near school crossings, where pedestrians are particularly at risk. Commonly accompanied by a lack of any signal.
- Not signalling early enough (or at all)

I am sure that you have a few favourites, that you are guilty of, OR that particularly irk you when driving.

Driving a vintage car also tends to add a few more to those favourites.

To all of you who have a car under the Club Permit Scheme.

Check your date of EXPIRY of your Permit.

ALSO check ALL details - including expiry date, addresses etc.

When paying ALWAYS retain your receipt.

Keep a scanned copy of your receipt with your logbook.

Please get a My VicRoads Account.

A My VicRoads Account also assures you of an email reminder for renewal of all your car registrations, permits and Drivers Licence.

Check your My VicRoads Account to ensure that your CPS cars appear

- you may need to take some additional action, for this to happen, but it is worthwhile



#### A BIT OF HISTORY - Park Orchards 1955

ONCE again a nice warm sun shone down on the hive of activity in the Car Park of the Blackburn Hotel at 9.30 on Sunday morning, August 14, for the start of the Park Orchards Trial, Of the 31 entries, 25 appeared at the start but two withdrew One of these was Fred Thorne in his 4-day-old special which was too tight to go mud-storming. This left 17 Austin 7's, 3 Renault 750's, 2 Volkswagens, a Morris Minor Special (not the modern jmitation bearing the same name) and a Singer 9 to face the starter

After some sorting out and scrutineering had been done, the first car set off at 10.10 a.m. and

made its way to the special tests on the usual steep bit of Park Road. Last year's tests were so successful that they were repeated this year, the first being a down-hill acceleration and braking test to stop astride a line, whilst the second was designed to check that cars had hand brakes, starting mechanisms and reverse gear

Not unexpectedly the best times were recorded by Ron Pizzey in a Volkswagen in both tests, second in both was Richard Dent in the Morris Minor and third were Doug Veel (Austin 7) in one and Ian Barns (VW) in the other. Those who failed because of a complete lack of everything shall be nameless

Old Road 1 was the first observed section, and because of its short, sharn nature it was divided into five parts, each scoring 20 points. A block and tackle and a large number of spectators helped all but one car up this hill, the exception being Ron Pizzey in his four-exhaustpad W. Illerally clowing his way up cluding five Austins, reached the 60 mark, Reg Williams being nearest to success.

Continuing along the track, competitors came to Old Road 2, a long climb which gets steeper fowards the end and two YW's, Bill Cooper's Singer 9 and the Morris Minor managed this, together with the four Austins of Belloir, Bradley, Funcill and Yeel. Most failures occurred on the green grass within a yard or two of the finish.

After a mere quarter mile on used public roads competitors plunged into the undergrowth on to unused public roads which led them down McIntyre's Road to the next section at Tecoma Street. This consisted of 20 yards of water, because Tecoma Street and a creek coincide. Some 50 yards further on cars were diverted off the track through a very small patch of mud. This patch fooled the perpetrators of this horer because any the first two Auxilia 7's managed. If the patch became impossible. However much fun was had in the first 20 yards, both by competitors and spectators.

Competitors who had fun churning up McIntyre's Road on the way, down were now faced with the problem of getting up again without stopping. Nine cars later, Doug Veel, who had walked up the track carefully plotting his route, took an entirely different course, and after scattering spectators he reached the top, thus upholding the tradition of the Austin 7. No one else managed, but brave tries were made by Ian Barns, Richard Dent and Keith Fleming.

There was now a short pause for funch; short because all the sections had taken longer than expected, or 12.45 it was an again—competitors in reverse order with a trip along harris Gully Road. In this case the road and a creek coincide for a considerable distance, although the track—what there is of 11—is comparatively flat. The two VWS, Morris Minor and the Austins of Fleming, Veel, Cole, Bradley and Bellair were the only successful ones.

A few yards from the end of this section was the next, consisting of the inevitable watery mud-hole followed by a dry hill-climb. This was managed by only five cars, the Austin 7's of Keith Fleming, Reg Williams, Trevor Cole, Mick Bellair and Maurie Mank.

Next came the highlight of the Trial, as far as spectators were concerned any-

way although competitors take a different view. This section, known as Oban Road East, must have attracted some 200 onlookers, and consisted of various hazards such as a creek crossing, a deep mud pool, a mud flat and a bumpy climb back on to the road, each feature scoring 20 points. The first to succeed was Richard bent in the Minor, and a few cars later Reg Tillians in Austra Doug Veel, who lost a plug lead after scoring 60. All the others sank in the mud pool.

Deep Creek come next, and this was a test of drivers' deep water technique. The water was only about 15 inches deep but it caught many who took it too fast, the hill offer it definitely requiring all the horsepower available, so if you lost one plug you had had it. Only three cars, once again all Austin 7's, passed this test. They were Doug Veel, Mick Belliar and Maurie Monk.

Finally there was Rubbish Tip, merely a steep winding hill marked in increments of 10 points, and all those who had engines managed this quite well.

## PRESERVING OUR CLUB HISTORY

#### **ARCHIVIST & CURATOR**

The Club needs some people to carry on the excellent work done by Laurie Allan, who managed to scan all our collection of Club Newsletters, and catalogue all these documents, and many more, and create records of much of the collections of memorabilia that the Club has.

However, this needs much additional work, but is not urgent. That said, any volunteer/s can work at their own pace.

The primary aim is to progressively make Club Members aware of the vast amount of information that is available.

In addition, the Club needs a volunteer, to work in partnership with the Archivist, to act as a Collections Curator, or an Exhibitions Curator, to address how the Club should properly look after its collections, and also to progressively create adequate descriptive material so that our members can understand the relevance, and importance, of each item in the Club's collections.

An important early project is to create suitable descriptive elements to accompany all the items in the Dickason collection, and also convert the extensive record of this collection into a form that is readily available to Club Members and visitors.

Similar descriptive items are also needed for all of the Club's displays, including our trophies collection.

It is also planned that all our extensive electronic records of our collections should be progressively made more available to members, and that these records are systematically supplemented by the significant quantity of additional Austin 7 history that is being steadily researched by many Club Members.

Perhaps some of these roles could suitably become part of a study for a person seeking a tertiary qualification.
