

# Minutes of General Meeting held on 13th February 2025 at the Clubrooms

There were 74 members and 1 guest in attendance, and 15 listed apologies.

President Robin Fletcher opened the meeting at 8.00 pm thanking those present for attending and ran through the Club's safety protocols.

New Members Maic Stelmach and Jovita Stevens were welcomed & presented with their badges.

**Bereavement** The death of local motoring identity Bryan Thomson was honored with a minute silence.

**Previous Minutes** of the December 12 General Meeting as printed in the Journal were amended with the date changed from 19 January to 9 January before being accepted following a motion from Michael Cannon and seconded by Lloyd Healey.

President's Business: Rob Fletcher presented the annual trophies for Clubman of the Year (Ken O'Connor), John Stewart Memorial Trophy (Fred & Elaine Williams), John Hill Trophy (Terry Brennan), the other two trophies were passed to members at a later date. He also reiterated that Ray Mullins' raffle was there to provide light entertainment, not raise funds. He went on to inform members of the need to make constitutional changes due to the change in our financial year caused by ATO demands.

## **Guest Speaker Pit Stop Sam Sharpe**

Pit Stop is a Lighthouse Project which works with students aged 12 to 18 who are disengaged with school. It is run at Deca/Wodonga TAFE site in Shepparton for 3 days a week. There is a maximum of 12 students per session and they may be involved for a whole term or a whole year.

There is paid staff and volunteers who work with the students for one and a half hours on projects such as jewellery making and electronics as well as woodworking where bird boxes are made.

There is a project car, a mid 90's Corolla which is used to teach the students how to change a tyre, check oil and filters etc.

Another outlet is called Second Spin, where pushbikes are refurbished and given to the needy. Students learn to weld where a bench was made and donated to a primary school.

There is a partnership with CMV Trucks where students can gain work experience.







## Notice of Proposed Changes to the Club's Constitution and By-Laws

In accordance with Rule 33 of the Club's Constitution [Monthly General Meetings], Notice is hereby given to all club members of the Committee's intention to propose a number of Special Resolutions at the Club's June General Meeting, to be held at the clubrooms on April 10th, 2025, commencing at 8:00pm.

In accordance with Constitution Rule 38 [Special Resolutions] and By-Law 19 [Changes to these By-Laws], the adoption of these proposed changes is contingent upon at least 75% of financial members present at the April General meeting voting in favour of each Special Resolution.

### Introduction

The Constitution and By-Laws define the rules by which our Club operates. These rules require periodic review to ensure our Club is operating effectively, efficiently and within the requirements of the law.

Proposed Special Resolutions #1, #2 and #3 are to introduce the changes necessary for the Club to conform to the standard business year (1st July to 30th June) as required by the Australian Taxation Office.

Special Resolution #4 is proposed to clarify the status of the five subcommittees defined in By-Law 8.

## **Special Resolution #1**

## Rule 3 Financial Year

Proposal:

Change the definition of the Club's Financial Year from "ending on 30th September" to "ending on 30th June" to align with the standard business year.

## **Special Resolution #2**

## **Rule 12 Annual Subscription**

Proposal:

- a) Amend Rule 12(1): The Committee will determine the annual fees payable by members, including membership fees, for the following financial year no later than the July April committee meeting.
- b) Amend Rule 12(2): The recommended fee scale determined in subrule (1) is to be presented to members no later than the August May general meeting for ratification.

#### Why:

It is proposed to align the Club's membership year with the revised Club financial year. These proposed changes are to facilitate the alignment.

## **Special Resolution #3**

## **By-Law 2 Meetings**

Proposal:

- a) Amend By-Law 2(1): The annual general meeting of the club shall be held on the second Thursday in November August.
- b) Amend By-Law 2(2): The club year commences on the day of the annual general meeting in November July 1st and for the purposes of the annual report and club finances the financial year concludes on September June 30.
- c) Amend By-Law 2(3): Member subscriptions are due by the annual general meeting each year July 1st and the amount for annual subscriptions is determined at the July April committee meeting to enable members to be financial by the annual general meeting July 1st.

## **Special Resolution #4**

By-Law 8 Permanent subcommittees

Proposal:

a) Replace the word 'permanent' with the word 'operational' in the By-Law title and subrule 8(1).

b) Amend By-Law 8(1): The Association has five (5) permanent operational subcommittees established by the Committee annually in accordance with Rule 42.

## Why:

The current wording may be construed to mean the five operational subcommittees are independent of the Committee's authorised delegation.



# Meeting Notes of the AOMC Delegates Meeting Monday February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at 7.30pm

The meeting was held at the Jaguar/Austin Healey clubrooms, Springvale There were 86 delegates in attendance representing 64 clubs.

Special General Meeting. Special Resolution proposing an additional class of membership to be called "MembershipPLUS" with eligibility and benefits determined by by-laws was moved by Lawrence Glynn (BMW Drivers) and seconded Keith Taylor (Chevrolet CC).

**Background:** Insurance is a problem cost wise for smaller clubs in particular. Plenty of work has been put in by committee volunteers to organise a group insurance scheme. There will be a meeting/seminar in May to go over the insurance scheme.

**Why:** The AOMC is not an insurance supplier and cannot sell insurance. The only way to offer the insurance is as an inclusion of membership. This resolution is to offer a membership category to facilitate this.

The resolution was put to the floor and was passed on an overwhelming show of hands with one proxy vote against.

**Changes in By Laws.** The following By Law changes were put to the floor.

Eligibility Criteria; Conditions for MembershipPLUS; Benefits of membership.

Numbers of members; Fee Schedule (including Insurance fees).

All changes were accepted unanimously.


