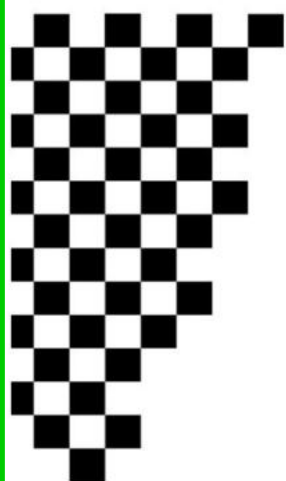
Mauro Boddi moved that due to the numbers and size of the event, that we form a committee to oversee the Federation event. Seconded by Neville Thomas - carried

Model A Ford National Rally - Maryborough QLD

Model A Ford Rally – Maryborough Queensland (Continued :-)

Day 6 – Had a look at the map last night and decided to aim for Biggenden (250 odd km). Have a friend there and would leave us just 100km into Maryborough. Found it better to talk with locals re roads than trust the GPS. Stopped for a cool drink break (Pretty warm again at an out of the way place called Durong South. About same size as Dooen !!), then across country to Ban Ban Springs where we stopped for lunch – quite warm, no shade. Made it to Biggenden mid afternoon and set up camp. Was having a chat with Nev when Hiiiiiss from his left rear wheel – The brass thread where its vulcanized to the valve extension simply let go. A first for me but Nev reckoned he'd seen it before.

Day 7 – Two options to Maryborough – we decided on the 'long cut' as locals recommended as road in better nick. Casual start – drove up to Childers where we met the main highway for the first time. Had a coffee in an antique picture theatre, complete with canvas chairs, fascinating. Leaving there we drove down to Maryborough and arrived at the registration point (Maryborough Showgrounds) at 11.30am. 2,300km from home. Registered, collected our Rally packs, then headed into town to find our caravan park and set up for the next week.

Day 8 - Monday. Up at 5.30am. (So much for a relaxing start). We had prebooked a bus trip to Bundaberg 1 ½ hours north and had to be at the pick up point at 6.15am. It was a great day – we were bussed up to an organized tour of the Bundaberg Rum Distillery. The local Historic Vehicle Club put on morning tea for us just as we arrived in Bundaberg, then lunch (after our Distillery Tour) at their magnificent Clubrooms. They did a wonderful job and it was really nice introducing ourselves and meeting their members. After lunch we were taken to the Bert Hinkler Aviation Museum which is well worth seeing. Could have easily spent a whole day there. 6.45pm when we arrived back at camp – no trouble sleeping that night.

Day 9 – Tuesday. Nice casual morning. We were able to give the cars a check over, out with the grease gun, oil change (yep – in the park !) and relax a bit. After lunch we visited an antique Engineering works/foundry (Olds Engineering). Still operating with some 100 year old plus machinery, Overhead leather belts. A really interesting few hours spent there.

Day 10 – Wednesday. The only day of the Rally where all 150 odd Model A Fords convoyed together. South to a Lychee farm where we enjoyed a 'bush' morning tea then 50 odd km to the Theebine Pub for lunch. Again Theebine is about the same as Dooen. An Historic Pub and not a lot else. However, they managed a magnificent BBQ lunch for just on 300 people and just a great spectacle to stand on the front balcony and view 150 odd Model A Fords parked out front.

Day 11 – Thursday. A market day in Maryborough and we were pre organized for our cars to be on static display from 8.00am until 2.00pm. Lynne, Neville Eltze, Gayle and myself were part of a group that enjoyed a guided 'walking tour' of historic Maryborough. Wolfgang (and he was actually German origin with a notable accent:) rated 9/10 in my opinion as a guide. His enthusiasm for history of the area was infectious. At end of static display, we did a bit of our own sightseeing around the town.

Day 12 – Friday This morning we drove approx. 50km across to Hervey Bay for another static display on the foreshore there. I did notice the cars were down on numbers as quite a few elected not to go, but no one appeared too worried.

Day 13 – Saturday A relaxing generally free day. Plenty of time to give the cars/trailers another once over, in preparation for the journey home beginning tomorrow. Time to mingle with other Model A enthusiasts in the park, enjoy a swim. Quite a few entrants had trailered cars to Maryborough behind motorhomes etc (understandable when one considers age of the vehicle. Age of the entrants and distances involved). Entrants were encouraged to dress in period costume for this evenings Gala Dinner and a large number wee right into it. Something we had better look into !!.

We travelled 115 kms for the day through some beautiful undulating country, the weather was warm and sunny.

On Sunday morning we met for a car display at the Lady Nelson Visitor Centre before leaving for the Kilsby Sinkhole which is a world renowned destination for snorkeling, scuba diving and free diving. We were taken down a steep track, down 2 small ladders to a platform just above the crystal clear water. Absolutely an amazing place!

A wide range of vehicles attended, some were -

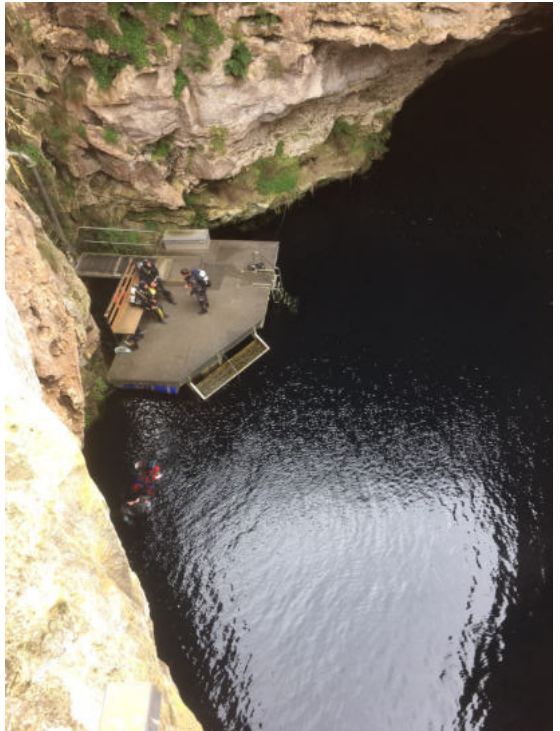

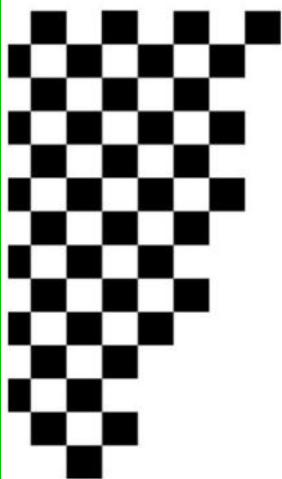
